

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Members of Avondale,

Shared on the following page is the **Order of Worship** to be used at our new 9:30 service on September 11. It embraces our Reformed tradition enabling us to use our God-given gifts to glorify God. In many ways the order is familiar. In other ways the order is more full and rich in liturgy. The order gleans the best from our two worship services and creates a new service that defines a conversation with what is holy.

Over the years, the issue within Presbyterian churches is not a matter of a liturgical versus a non-liturgical service. The problem has been *bad* liturgy - shapeless and formless - and the search for proper means by which it might be reformed and improved. The Order of Worship guiding our new single service offers a deeper meaning than merely patching pieces of traditional and contemporary together.

The fullness of this liturgy recognizes the mystery and downward movement of God, becoming real

in Jesus Christ, and an upward movement of our response, with the Holy Spirit bringing life with the encounter of grace and faith.

When the act of worship takes on meaning, it will carry a specific and definitive shape.

It will have time for preparation and proclamation. It will express gratitude and send those who worship out into the world affirming the mighty acts of God.

Great worship will emerge as a way of life and an ongoing partnership with God. The liturgy provides to a theological rudder which will guide our ship as we come back together as a worshipping community. Truly great worship, with the help of the Holy Spirit, will have a shape and claim that will change the character of our common life.

Stewardship in Discipleship: Congregational Life

The meals serve the same premise - pulling people together. Connecting people from both services together. People of all ages together. Through hospitality, Congregational Life creates opportunities to meet and care about the person sitting next to you.

The Congregational Retreat, formerly called the Family Retreat, has been an incredible, rewarding experience in bringing everyone together. Taking the church bus has enabled more people to go and enjoy. Another thing Congregational Life does.

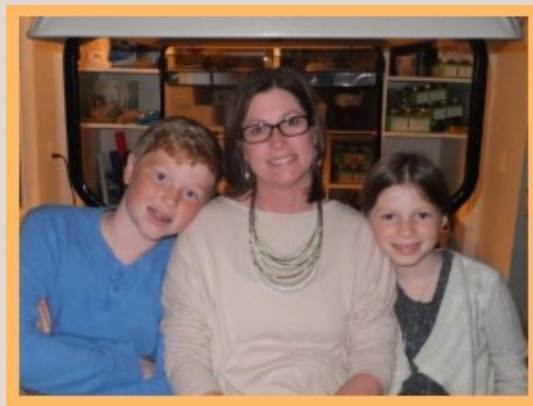
Ways people can help with Congregational Life? First, be present. When you are present, then you can see where you fit in. Hospitality, when you think about this, it's not just about getting flowers and showing up. It is the tools you use with hospitality... kitchen, storage, pantry, tables and chairs, food... Members of the church can serve, share their gift of time, by doing what they like to do or where they like to be. Cooking, organizing, shopping, coordinating, behind the scenes or greeting at the entrance.... work alone or work as part of a group.

Louise Lawson shares that it was many years before she got involved. Before someone asked her to help. And she didn't really want to. Her priority was taking care of her kids. But she said yes. Then, being on this team became part of taking care of her kids. The kids got involved. They spend time together on this, the kids learn new things. It all worked out. She loves doing the pieces of hospitality that create larger connections, fellowship and community.



Stewardship in Discipleship: Interview in Worship: Jennifer Patterson

Jennifer Patterson has been a member of Avondale for 14 years. Jennifer is a current Elder and serves as the facilitator for the Worship Gathering Group. She and her family can be found on the front row at the ARISE service most every Sunday morning.



Q. Why worship?

A. For me, worship is all about God. It's my time to praise God, to be reminded of His gift of grace, to acknowledge my shortcomings, and to ask for forgiveness. Too often I lose sight of God between Monday and Saturday, and I need Sunday morning worship to restore my relationship with God.

Q. Why worship together?

A. Well, I love my church family, and worship is the one time each week when we all get together. But, more importantly, worshipping together is important for me because it is a reflection of how we should live our lives and grow our faith - together!

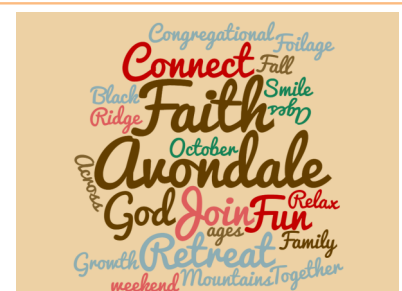

Q. Why be involved in worship?

A. There are so many important reasons to be involved in worship. 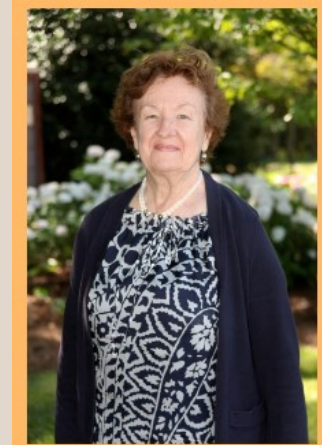


Stewardship in Discipleship: Interview in Worship: Sigrid Sacra

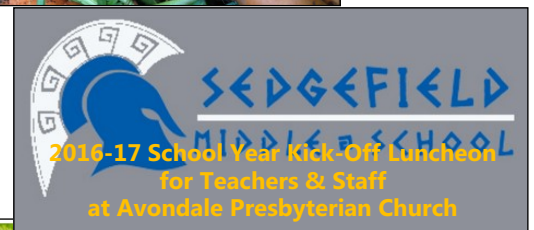
Youth Fellowship Kick-Off for 2016-17 Sunday, September 11
