

CHRISTMAS JOY

Dear Members of Avondale,

The children of the Adventure Choir sang their hearts out as they caroled in front of Blackhawk Hardware this week. A little girl danced on the sidewalk and parents paused, listened and applauded.

It's the uncommon festivity from children that we have come to expect at Christmas time. An innocent, spontaneous expression of joy that erupts from children. I am aware that the welfare of the world tomorrow will have much to do with how we treat our children today.

But it is this dominant focus upon children at Christmas which makes me rethink the true meaning of Christmas. John Bell, that eccentric, white-robed theologian living on the Island of Iona, Scotland, reminds me that the only reference to children in the Christmas story was the Christ-child and those who were slaughtered by Herod. His conclusion: "Excepting Jesus, I could find no children implicitly or explicitly involved." Bell's argument to faithfulness in the Christmas story is that Christmas is about *old people*.

That's why an illumination of "what ifs" came to me when a member of our congregation shared that her greatest joy of the season came when listening to the older adult choir in a nursing home. Yes, a nursing home choir singing the carols of the season. If Christmas Day begins with the birth of a Child, the message of the Day is given to adults to convey.

*God, we pray that the joy and hope of this week
will displace the fears and suspicions
which come with the shadows of winter.
Steady your faith in the attitude
of Christmas joy and thanksgiving.*

Perhaps the best interpretation of Christmas is found in all people and pieces which call for us to *rethink* the meaning of the season and the importance of extending the season into a lifetime of faithfulness.

Beyond our deserving, we embrace Christmas. We pray that this infusion of joy will endure into the coming year. A deeper meaning of the Incarnation will prepare our congregation for what is yet to come. As a faith community, you have given me many reasons to say, "Jesus Christ is born here." A few I share:



- *It's about giving.* One person gave her car to Avondale to be sold for the mission of Avondale. Another family offered a check saying, "You know where it is needed." A daughter and grand daughter presented a check from their beloved grandmother, now deceased, with the promise that it be used for the future of this faith community she loved.

- *It's about giving.* I thank God for the little giant, Ginny Mitchell, and her centering of purpose and ministry as she has served as Administrative Coordinator over these past five years. I thank God for faithfulness lived out by all members of our church staff.

- *It's about giving.* A member stood, prior to a Saturday basketball game, and shared his witness of Jesus Christ who is Lord of his life. So many within our faith community give of their time and money because they believe that Christmas holds another sense of values in which true worth lies.

- *It's about giving.* While I rarely say this to my church family, I rejoice and thank God for my immediate family; my wife and two children who are my primary, fleshly definition of an Incarnate God.

I wish you a Blessed and Extended Christmas Day.
